### Voter Registration Drive Training

Virginia law requires any individual or organization requesting 25 or more voter registration applications from the Department of Elections or a local voter registration office to complete ELECT certified training.

- Training + Submission of Sworn Affidavit = Certification
- Certification expires each year on June 30. Individuals and organizations must renew their certification each year, on or after July 1<sup>st</sup>.







### **Best Practices**



- Only register Virginia residents who are *not currently registered* or whose voter registration information *needs updating* (Voters can check their registration status by visiting **vote.virginia.gov**)
- Remind applicants to complete the form accurately and neatly
- Provide a receipt to each applicant containing your contact information and the local Voter Registration Office phone number
- Deliver applications to the local Voter Registration Office or ELECT within
   10 days of receipt or by 5:00 pm on the registration deadline
- Provide an alphabetical listing of applications





# Please be sure that you DO NOT:



- Do not pre-populate the application with any information
- Do not solicit multiple applications from one person
- Do not provide false information regarding voter registration
- Do not destroy, make changes to, or alter completed applications
- Do not copy the Social Security Number
- Do not discriminate, bribe, threaten, coerce, or intimidate
- Do not write or attach partisan materials to the application



# Voter Registration Qualifications

- Be a United States citizen
- Be a resident of Virginia
- Be 18 years old by the next general election
  - (Any person who is otherwise qualified and is 16 years of age or older may preregister to vote)



 Have had your capacity restored if you have ever been adjudicated mentally incapacitated by a court





# Code of Virginia – Definition of Residence

"Residence" or "resident," for all purposes of qualification to register and vote, means and requires both domicile and a place of abode. To establish a domicile, a person must live in a particular locality with the intention to remain. A place of abode is the physical place where a person dwells.

- A college student may register to vote based on his/her intention to return home after college, or to remain in the college area
- They may only have one residence as it pertains to Voter Registration and that residence will determine their ballot choices Congressional District, State Senate, etc.
- This residence definition pertains to incarcerated individuals who may want to use their home address to register to vote



# Preregistration of 16 and 17 year olds

(§§ 24.2-403 and 24.2-403.1)

- Qualified applicants at least 16 years old who will not be 18 on or before the next general election may preregister
- Uses standard voter registration application
- Will be held by the local voter registration office and processed once the applicant becomes eligible to vote
- NOTE: If turning 18 on or before the day of the next General election, will be permitted to preregister and vote in any intervening primary or special elections



# Restoration of Rights



- Anyone convicted of a felony in Virginia automatically loses certain civil rights – the right to vote, serve on a jury, run for office, become a notary public, and carry a firearm
- The Constitution of Virginia gives the Governor the sole discretion to restore civil rights, including the right to vote (not including firearm rights)
- The Governor will consider restoration of rights for individuals who have completed all terms of incarceration, even if they remain on community supervision

### **WAYS TO VOTE**

#### RECEIVE A BALLOT BY MAIL

Request a ballot at <u>elections.virginia.gov/absentee</u> by **5 p.m., June 6**. You may return your ballot:

- By mail: postmarked on or before June 17 and received by noon on Friday, June 20.
- Before Election Day: to your voter registration office, drop-off location, or satellite location.
- On Election Day (by 7 p.m.): to your voter registration office, any polling place, or drop-off location.

\*Since July 1, 2023, witness signatures are not required to vote by mail. You will need to provide the last four digits of your social security number and year of birth. If you do not have a social security number, you can provide your voter ID number instead.

#### IN PERSON BEFORE ELECTION DAY

#### From May 2 through June 14:

You can vote early at your local voter registration office. A satellite voting location may also be available. Bring acceptable ID.

Voters may register in person after this date, through Election Day, and vote using a provisional ballot

June 6 (by 5 p.m.) - Last day to request that a ballot be mailed to you

June 7 (Saturday) - Local voter registration offices open for in-person voting

June 14 (Saturday) - Last day to vote early in-person at your local voter registration office

**June 17 (Election Day) -** Vote at your polling place. Polls are open 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

#### **BRING YOUR ID**

You need to show acceptable ID or sign an ID Confirmation Statement to vote in person for all Virginia elections.

#### Acceptable forms of identification

- Voter confirmation documents
- Virginia DMV-issued driver's license or ID card (current or expired)\*
- United States Passport (valid)
- · Employer-issued photo ID (valid)
- Student ID issued by a Virginia college / university / high school (valid)
- Student photo ID issued by U.S. college / university (valid)
- Other U.S. or Virginia governmentissued ID
- . U.S. Military ID (valid)
- Virginia Voter Photo ID Card
- Original or copy of any current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government documents with your name and address (within the past 12 months)

\*Neither a Virginia Driver Privilege Card nor an out of state license is acceptable for voting purposes.

### WHAT TO EXPECT AT THE POLLS

When you arrive, election officers will be there to help you:

### 1. CHECK IN


Say or write your name and address. Show an acceptable ID.

### 2. RECEIVE & CHECK BALLO T

Make sure it includes all contests for your district.

### 3. GO TO BOOTH & VOTE







When you're done, scan your ballot.

If there is any issue, please ask an election officer for assistance.

### **VOTER RIGHTS**

- Ask for a new ballot if you want to change your vote before you cast it
- ★ Vote a provisional ballot if your name doesn't appear on the voter list or you forgot to bring an acceptable ID (and refuse to sign an ID Confirmation Statement).
- ★ Vote if you are in line by 7 p.m. on Election Day when the polls close.

### **ACCESSIBLE VOTING**

There are accessible voting options at each polling place and early voting location.


If you are 65 or older, or have a disability, you can vote from your vehicle at the polls on Election Day or at your local voter registration office before Election Day. Locate a curbside voting sign for instructions on how to alert elections staff of your need for curbside assistance. You may also bring someone with you who can assist you with voting. You can get help reading or writing from an election officer or your own assistant.


If you are blind, have low vision, or have impaired manual dexterity (e.g. have a print disability), accessible voting options are available, including but not limited to using an electronic ballot marking tool for absentee ballots and accessible voting equipment at the polling place. Your general registrar or an officer of election can assist you in accessing these options.




